Black History Month is an opportunity to celebrate the contribution Black communities and individuals have made over the centuries in shaping the dynamic and diverse country we have today.

The formal elements of art are the 'building block' for creating art. To develop as an artist pupils need to utilise at least a few of them. Knowing about the elements allows them to describe what an artist has done, analysis what's going on in a piece and communicate thoughts and findings using common language.

Anti-bullying week falls within this half term. This unit is designed to raise awareness of bullying to highlight ways to prevent and respond to it. By introducing the topic within art it allows pupils to explore different roles and perspectives. Focusing on Keith Haring 'best buddies' promotes the idea that friendships and Inclusion can help end Bullying.

Pupils will continue to develop their knowledge about the fundamental elements of art. They will be introduced to different medium within art so they can develop skills and techniques.

Pupils will focus on the formal element of colour to cement their understanding of colour theory.

To develop pupils knowledge on different cultures and continue to be interested in exploring. improving understanding of and showing respect for different faiths and cultural diversity and accept and respect diversity. Pupils will learn that Liverpool is a large multi-cultural population and a high percentage of which are Chinese. They will learn about Chinese traditions and Liverpool's vibrant China town. They will look at using different media to recreate some Chinese traditional art.

The unit has been chosen to allow pupils the opportunity to discuss and celebrate the history and cultural aspect of their local city. They will learn about how artists have gained inspiration from the city's history and created what is now a well-recognised sculpture and symbol closely linked with Liverpool City.

To showcase pupils work empowering them to engage further in learning, foster a deep sense of engagement and celebrate achievements. They will build on skills they have developed throughout the academic year and demonstrate they can master particular skills and techniques. They will create an independent project that will promote self-confidence and selfmotivation. The unit will demonstrate skills and knowledge pupils have learnt and let them have freedom to make creative choices and decisions.

To allow pupils the opportunity to discuss and celebrate cultural opportunities in school and their local area. They will look at The Love Art scheme which provides the opportunity for them to look at and learn from working artists in school. They will be able to see Art work first hand displayed in school and have the chance to critique and be inspired by it. They will learn about how artists have gained inspiration for their work and focus on creating work inspired by them.

They continue to develop their understanding of the formal elements of art which are the buildings blocks for any artist and demonstrate how they can use them in their art so they can become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques
